Cross Country

The cross country league and championship is organised by the Cross Country Secretary. Clubs participating in the league are invited to promote a meeting. They are given £100 to cover any costs and may provide refreshments to generate more income for themselves.

The dates of the league usually match the weeks 41, 44, 50 and 7 for the league whilst the championships are week 1. The first weekend of March has often been used as a reserve date in case of cancellation. However with difficulties in finding venues it has been used for the fourth and final meeting.

In the 23/24 season the championships were incorporated into the Dec league fixture.

Entries are open in the middle of August or early September usually on entrycentral.com .

GAAA enters teams into the Inter-counties CC Championships. These are held around the second or third weekend of March. There is no website for the promoting body CAU; entry is by the team manager through SportSoft Entries & Results (race-results.co.uk). Selection is usually based on performances in the GAAA CC Championships with some discretionary places in each age group. The email address for the secretary is Joseph Mower @ohotmail.com.

Entry Details:

Each County/District is invited to enter up to 12 athletes per event with 8 to run and 4 only to score for team awards, with the exception of the Senior Men and Senior Women's races, which shall be 15 to enter, with 9 to run and 6 to score for the team.

A coach leaving from Gloucester and Cheltenham is provided for competitors, team managers and supporters.

There will be two pick up points: 7.30 a.m. at the Greyhound Inn at Longlevens in Gloucester (just off the A40 by-pass round-about at the Gloucester end of the A40 by-pass from Cheltenham) and 7.50 a.m. at the Prince of Wales Stadium in Cheltenham. Arrival at Prestwick Hall will be at about 09:45 with departure after 16:00. Please arrive so that we can leave on time so that the competitors in the first race can prepare well. The cost will be £6.00 for adults and £3.00 for everyone aged 20 or under. Parents/supporters may travel on the coach if they wish.

There is no shelter apart from our two tents which will be shared by all athletes and team managers. The weather forecast is for a maximum of 11° with light wind and little chance of rain. Please bring chair and warm clothing for before and after your race. There will be refreshments.

The county can loan you a vest on the day, which must be returned to the team tent after your race. Alternatively, you may purchase one at a cost of £15.00 if you wish to keep it.

The county will organise a coach to the venue for those who do not wish to make their own arrangements. There will be two pick up points: possibly 7.30 a.m. at the Greyhound Inn at Longlevens in Gloucester (just off the A40 by-pass roundabout at the Gloucester end of the A40 by-pass from Cheltenham) and possibly 7.50 a.m. at the Prince of Wales Stadium in Cheltenham. The cost will be 10.00 for adults and £5.00 for everyone aged 20 or under. Parents/supporters may travel on the coach.

Athletes travelling under their own arrangements should report to the team tent (green with the county flag displayed nearby) to collect their vest. Numbers and computer chips should also be collected from the team tent and you should arrive at the venue in time to collect all these items, do your warm up and then go through a check-in marquee where the organisers will check that the computer chip is attached correctly before allowing you onto the start area.

Please NOTE that ALL entries are to be done online again this year and no later than Monday 5th February 2024.

Entry Details:

Each County/District is invited to enter up to 12 athletes per event with 8 to run and 4 only to score for team awards, with the exception of the Senior Men and Senior Women's races, which shall be 15 to enter, with 9 to run and 6 to score for the team.

PLEASE NOTE: If an Athlete competes in an England County, Scottish District, Welsh Region or Northern Ireland XC Championships, in the year of competition, then they can only represent that County, District, Region or Northern Ireland in the InterCounties.

Awards:

UK County Athletic Union Championship Plaques will be awarded to the first three individuals to finish and Medals to the four scoring members of the first three teams to finish, excepting for the Senior Men and Senior Women's races which shall be the six scoring team members. UK CAU Medals will also be awarded to the most improved team in the Senior Men's races.

UK CAU Inter County Championship Trophies shall be awarded to the first Senior Men's team to finish nine runners, the Most Improved Team in the Senior Men's and the best overall performance in the championships.

Please note that the Presentations of Individual and Team awards will take place on the course at 13.00 for first four races, and again at 14.40 and leaving the Senior Men's when its ready.

Note that you may need to set up a new account on the system if you do not have an account for your county entries – club entry accounts are not valid.

You will be able to add/delete athletes if required (until the entry closing date) by logging back into your entry.

Date

Usually EA & UKA recommend dates in May. This is often late for planning (But not this year 2024-Track-and-Field-Fixtures-Final-V1-180923-Protected.xlsx (live.com) and the provisional 2022 dates are

- part 1 April 29/30
- part 2 May 14/5 (recommended date)
- part 3 yet to be decided.

Location

The Championship alternates location between the tracks in Gloucester and Cheltenham with part 3 being in the second location for that year.

Cheltenham is used for parts 1 & 2 in even years and Gloucester part 3.

Entries

https://www.race-results.co.uk/results/2021/ was used along with https://entry4sports.com/ Race results seemed to offer a simpler and more user friendly approach although entry4sports.com has improved since May 2021.

The entry form will also need to allow athletes to identify as guests who are not eligible for medals.

Ideally entries will close 7 to 10 days before the event to allow time for seeding and communication of the final timetable.
